



Must-read Mystery Series



Bennett, S.J. 


Cambridge, Colleen. Phyllida Bright (2021) - start with Murder at Mallowan Hall

Griffiths, Elly. **Harbinder Kaur** (2019) - start with *The Stranger Diaries*

Sharp-witted and perceptive Detective Sergeant Harbinder Kaur investigates in Griffith's latest series. Combining intricate plots, rich character development (including Sikh, lesbian Kaur), and a strong sense of place (the UK), Griffiths excels at blending traditional detective work with contemporary issues, such as cultural identity and social dynamics. Unique secondary characters sometimes take center stage and are equally well-developed and compelling.

Harper, Jane. Aaron Falk (2018) - start with The Dry

Featuring Federal Agent Aaron Falk, these novels combine taut, atmospheric storytelling with deeply human characters and intricate plots. Harper's skillful writing brings the rugged Australian setting to life, making it an integral part of the narrative and almost a character in itself. Themes of isolation, survival, and the harshness of the natural environment are reflected in the Australian setting. 


Spotswood, Stephen. **Pentecost and Parker** (2020) - start with *Fortune Favors the Dead*

Steiner, Susie. Manon Bradshaw (2016) - start with Missing, Presumed

Centered around Detective Sergeant (later Detective Inspector) Manon Bradshaw and set in Cambridgeshire, England, Bradshaw is a distinctive protagonist, known for her intelligence, insight, and deeply human flaws. A middle-aged woman navigating the challenges of single motherhood, professional pressures, and personal insecurities, Manon is portrayed with authenticity and depth. Family dynamics, social justice, and personal redemption all come into play as Steiner offers a realistic portrayal of modern police work.





Weaver, Ashley. Electra McDonnell (2021) - start with A Peculiar Combination

A combination of historical fiction and mystery set in World War II-era London, Weaver's latest series follows Electra "Ellie" McDonnell, a skilled safecracker and thief turned amateur sleuth, who is recruited by British Intelligence to aid in the war effort. Questions relating to duty, redemption, and the moral ambiguities of war are explored as Weaver skillfully blends historical facts with fiction, creating a vivid portrayal of wartime London and the clandestine operations of British Intelligence. The novels also incorporate elements of romance and suspense, adding depth to the narrative.
